



Eisenhower HS will have its first Women's Studies class in the Fall 2021. This elective course will examine the history, experiences, and contributions of women to society. Explore the social role of women shaping contemporary history and politics.

This is a sectional rehearsal class that allows for specific instruction of Afro-Latin instruments such as: flute. Saxophone, Trumpet, Trombone, Congas, Bangos, Bass Guitar, Tres, Guitar and Piano which are apart of the Afro-Latin Ensemble. Class time is utilized for highly specific Afro-Latin instrumental techniques, styles, form and instruction, as well as sectional rehearsal of Afro-Latin literature. This ensemble will instruct students to perform various styles such as: Son, Chachacha, Bolero, Merengue, Guaguanco, Bembe, Samba, Festejo, Lando, Bomba, Mambo, Danzon, Plena, and Salsa.
