

Changing the Default Location for Downloading Files in Google CHROME (for Illuminate or Synergy)

The servers where your data is saved do not have an infinite amount of storage space. Your default storage limit is 100mb. When trying to download files, you might receive an error stating that the download has been interrupted, the download stays in an endless loop or not all pages print from your download. This problem happens because the default location that files are downloaded to is in your “My Documents” folder, which is on the server. If you have reached your storage limit, the file can’t save. You will need to change the location of where the files download. The directions for changing the location follow.

Create Storage Folder

You will need to create a folder on your hard drive for storage. Since these files are temporary and can be recreated, they will not be backed up unless you manually back them up.

1. Open “My Computer” or “Computer”



2. Double-click “Local Disk C:” or “OSDISK (C:)”
3. Go to File → New → Folder, or Click on “New Folder”



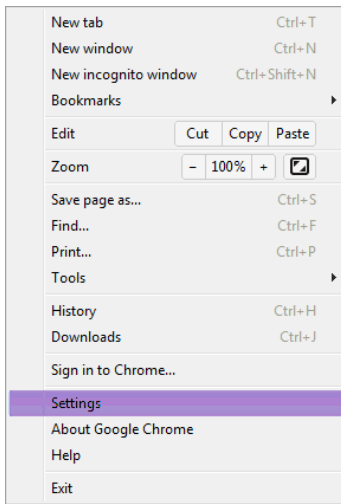
4. A new folder will be created
5. Type the name of the new folder- we are using “Illuminate Files” in this example – push the “Enter” key

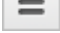


Change Setting in CHROME

Next, you will need to change a setting in CHROME to point to the new folder.

1. Open Google CHROME



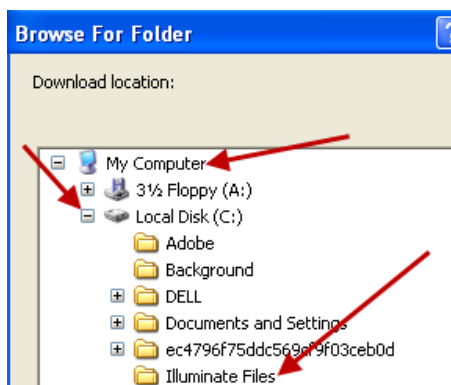
2. Click the Chrome menu  on the browser toolbar.

3. Select “Settings”

4. Click on “Show Advanced Settings” (you might have to arrow down to find this)

5. Find the section labeled “Downloads” (again, you might need to arrow down) and click on “Change”



6. Expand (click the +) “My Computer” → “Local Disk (C:)” click on “Illuminate Files”

7. Click "OK" the Download location will now show as C:\Illuminate Files

8. Close the browser and open CHROME

All of the files you download from CHROME will now be in this new location. These files are not backed up; they can be recreated if you need them again. Follow your usual procedure for backing up your files if you wish to back them up.
