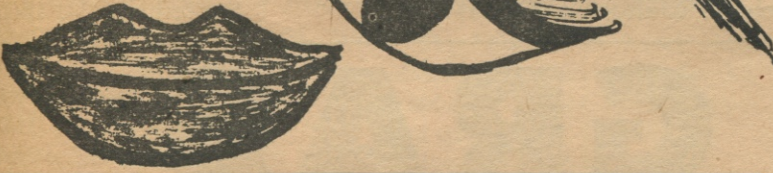
November 5, there will be a Girls' League conference at Barstow.

The fourth quarter was the decisive period. South Pasadena completed a deep right end pass with a thrilling last-minute drive to pick up the winning touchdown.

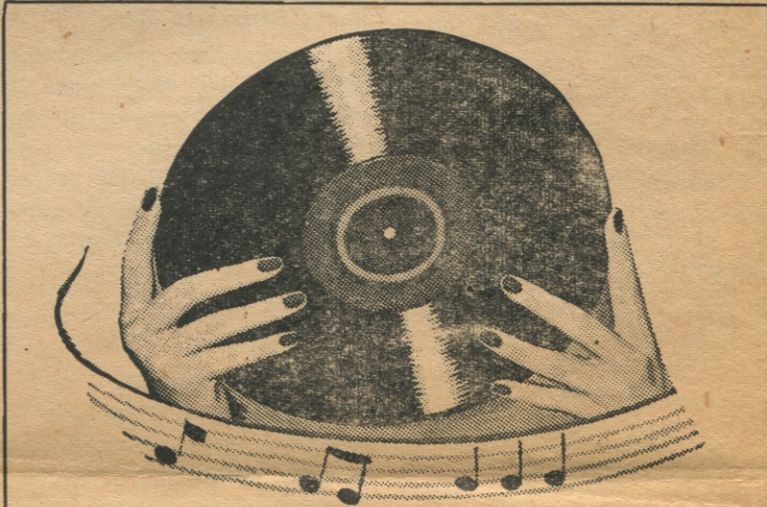
