## CUSTODIAN I - SWIMMING POOL

### DEFINITION:

Under the direction of an assigned Administrator or Supervisor, operate, clean, repair, and maintain the swimming pool and related equipment; perform routine custodial and maintenance tasks; and perform other job-related duties as assigned and/or required.

### ESSENTIAL DUTIES:

- Perform a variety of duties and activities related to preventive maintenance and repair of swimming pool equipment and the cleaning of a swimming pool.
- Operate pool filters and pumps.
- Test pool water for chemical content and balance and apply proper chemicals as needed.
- Clean swimming pool water purification systems.
- Perform routine repairs and adjustments to pumps, chlorination equipment utilized with a large commercial type swimming pool.
- Utilizes modern technology to monitor and adjust large commercial pool equipment
- Identify and report needed repairs and maintenance problems.
- Brush, skim, and vacuum pool surface, wash down deck and scrub swimming pool tile surfaces.
- Replace empty chlorine tanks.
- Clean pool deck and adjacent areas.
- Clean and maintain office and locker room areas.
- Requisition, receive, store, and maintain an adequate inventory of swimming pool supplies and materials.
- Review and monitor the swimming pool maintenance activities to ensure compliance with State and County regulations.
- Maintain records pertaining to a swimming pool.
- Store, maintain, and set up as necessary aquatic athletic equipment.
- May be assigned to custodial duties as a part of the school's custodial staff.
- Perform other job-related duties as assigned and/or as required.

### KNOWLEDGE AND ABILITIES:

#### KNOWLEDGE OF:

- Methods, techniques, supplies, materials, and equipment utilized in the cleaning, care, and maintenance of a large commercial type swimming pool.
- Methods, techniques, and procedures used in maintaining and performing routine maintenance of swimming pool related equipment.
- Basic custodial cleaning methods.
- Safe working methods and procedures.

#### ABILITY TO:

- Sanitize, clean, and maintain a commercial type swimming pool.

- Prepare and maintain needed records and reports.
- Make simple arithmetic calculations.
- Adjust work schedules to accommodate school aquatic activities.
- Develop and maintain cooperative working relationships.

## **EXPERIENCE AND EDUCATION:**

### EDUCATION:

Verification of a High School diploma, a GED certificate, or a higher degree supplemented by training or course work in the operation and maintenance of a commercial type swimming pool.

### EXPERIENCE:

Recent job-related experience within the last five years is required.

## **LICENSES, CERTIFICATIONS, AND OTHER REQUIREMENTS:**

- Verification of a valid California Department of Motor Vehicle Operator's license.
- Insurability by the District's liability insurance carrier may be required.
- Commercial swimming pool maintenance certificate issued by the County, or its equivalent.
- A standard Red Cross First Aid Certificated, which includes CPR training.

## **WORKING CONDITIONS:**

### ENVIRONMENT:

Indoor and outdoor work environment: Noise (equipment operation). Driving a vehicle to conduct work.

### PHYSICAL ELEMENTS:

The physical requirements indicated below are examples of the physical aspects that this position classification must perform in carrying out essential job functions.

- Will infrequently exert 50 to 75 pounds of force to lift, carry, push, pull, or otherwise move objects.
- Will walk or stand for extended periods while sitting some of the time, will regularly ascend and descend ladders, stairs and ramps.
- Must possess the ability to hear and perceive the nature of sound.
- Must possess visual acuity and depth perception.
- Must be capable of providing oral information, both in person and over the telephone/other communication devices.
- Must possess the manual dexterity to operate hand tools and to handle and work with various materials and objects.

Reasonable accommodation may be made to enable a person with a disability to perform the essential functions of the job.

### POTENTIAL HAZARDS:

Chemicals, dust, fumes, and odors. Working around machinery having moving parts. Bending, kneeling, or crouching. Excessive noise. May be occasionally exposed to hot, cold, wet, humid, or windy conditions caused by weather.
