INDEPENDENT STUDY TEACHER (4th – 8th)

DEFINITION

Under the supervision and direction of the Agent: Child Welfare and Attendance. The independent study teacher provides an individualized program of instruction through Independent Study in all academic areas students in $4^{th} - 8^{th}$ grade and other duties as assigned.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES

- Works with the Agent: Child Welfare and Attendance in planning and implementing an individualized academic program for each student enrolled in the Independent Study program.
- Prepares and teaches individualized course work, which meets the requirements in the areas of Math, English, Reading, Social Studies, Science, and other subjects consistent with a personalized educational plan.
- Determines instructional materials designed to achieve instructional goals and behavioral objectives.
- Selects books appropriate to the interest and maturity levels of pupils.
- Ascertains the achievement level of each student through testing, investigation of previous records, professional opinion, and/or any other methods deemed necessary.
- Evaluates each pupil's progress in courses and prepares progress reports.
- Promotes and encourages a positive attitude towards school on the part of the student.
- Maintains professional competence through participation in in-service education activities provided by the district and/or in self-selected professional growth activities.
- Knowledge of and familiarity with Rialto Unified School District's programs.
- Other duties as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS

- School policies and procedures, which govern the Board, program, outcomes, and curriculum.
- California State curriculum frameworks as well as effective teaching strategies that ensure student's learning in required subjects with focus on what is most successful in the independent study setting.
- Student learning styles, inventory techniques and organizational skills.
- Effective teaching strategies to ensure pupil learning in subjects taught.
- Applicable sections of State Education Code and other State publications that apply, such as curriculum frameworks and testing procedures and protocols.
- Curriculum, instruction, and assessment processes and how they should operate in an effective independent study program.
- Technology and computer software applications relative to instruction and administration.
- Social resources including but not limited to material resources, learning centers and vendor course instruction.

- Plan and teach individualized lessons for one-to-one instruction
- Understand, accept and work individual differences in students and parent(s)/guardian(s)
- Effectively work with and relate to students with independent education needs and their parent(s)/guardian(s)
- Establish and maintain cooperative relationships with students, parent(s)/guardian(s), all school staff, vendors, and the public
- Communicate effectively in the English language both orally and in writing
- Meet required schedules and timelines
- Maintain detailed records and student folders
- Be highly organized
- Work independently
- Analyze situations accurately and adopt and appropriate and effective course of action
- Learn and use technology and computer software applications efficiently as appropriate to the work environment

- Use tact, patience, and courtesy when dealing with all people
- Use positive professional demeanor as well as initiative and judgment while discussing problems with students, parent(s)/guardian(s), staff and the public involving student portfolios, information or performance, school policies or practices while maintaining appropriate confidentiality
- Understand and be sensitive to those of culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds.
- Maintain a positive professional demeanor and appropriate confidentiality at all times
