Superintendent, Dr. Avila, read the following public comments which were received via email:

Gil Navarro, Water Board Director, Division II, with the San Bernardino Valley Municipal Water District, shared the continued opportunity of financial support with implementing water conservation in the District. He stated that in November of 2019, Rialto Unified School District was reimbursed by Valley Water District for turf rebates at Rialto Middle School in the sum of \$25,244.70, and at Kelley Elementary School in the sum of \$21,294.00.

Frances Bernal, Parent, submitted the following questions for the Board of Education: Will online learning be ready to be implemented for students bu Monday, April 13, 2020? Will the school year extend beyond the end of May to make up for the lost time?

Tobin Brinker, Teacher, thanked the Education Services department, including all teachers and administrators who have been working overtime to make the transition to distance learning. He also thanked the REA bargaining team for their work on the MOU for distance learning. He then

shared some concerns from teachers regarding grading of student work during distance learning and whether report card grades will reflect end of year grades.

Mr. Brinker then indicated that he has emailed Ms. Rhonda Kramer on a couple of occasions requesting a copy of the latest Seniority List and has received no response. He indicated that teachers are being asked to respond to parent emails within 24 hours, yet he has not been able to receive a response in the last month.

His final concern was regarding the planning of next year's school calendar. He shared some suggestions he received from teachers including the possibility of delaying the start of the next school year until after Labor Day depending on the need based on the danger of this virus. Another suggestion was to have a flex calendar in case the need for sheltering at home again in the coming spring occurs. He indicated that he is not advocating for either of these options, but he is advocating for a proactive approach and encourages the Board to address this issue sooner better than later.

Background:

Building Assets, Reducing Risks (BARR) is a strengths-based model that provides schools with a comprehensive approach to meeting the academic and social-emotional needs of all students. Schools within the BARR Service harness the power of data and relationships to empower all students to thrive inside and outside the classroom.

Reasoning:

Afford Rialto High School with the opportunity to obtain BARR Services and to participate in the Network for School Improvement (NSI) project for the purpose of increasing college-ready, on-track rates for African American, Latinx and low-income students. The grant will be funded through a fouryear period (2020-2021, 2021-2022, 2022-2023, and 2023-2024) with the first three years receiving up to \$8,500.00 for each year and the last year receiving up to \$5,000.00, for a total contract amount not-to-exceed \$30,500.00.

This is in line with the District's Strategic Plan, Strategy 3 - We will create a culture of high expectations within Rialto Unified School District and our community; and Strategy 7 - We will ensure resources and assets are allocated and developed to directly support student learning experiences.

Background:

AVID is designed as a systematic approach to increase schoolwide learning and to increase college going rate of students who may be first in their family to go to college. The mission of AVID is to ensure that all students who are capable of completing a college preparatory path will: Succeed in rigorous curriculum; enter mainstream activities of the school; increase their enrollment in four-year colleges; and become educated and responsible participants and leaders in a democratic society. Rialto Unified School District started using the AVID program since 1989 at Eisenhower High School, which was the only high school at that time. Since then it has expanded to all comprehensive high schools, middle schools and two elementary schools. Over 90% of AVID Seniors go to a four year college.

Reasoning:

As part of the District's Strategic Plan, Strategy 3 - the plan to promote AVID schoolwide aims to create a culture of high expectations within the Rialto Unified School District and our community. The AVID membership agreement provides training for teachers, staff, and administrators on teaching strategies as well as strategies to develop a school-wide culture of high expectations. The use of AVID Center products in the classroom with students includes software for students in the program ranking from grades K-12. The products also include the AVID Weekly Newsletter, coaching, and free coordinator workshops as well as access to regional trainings and AVID Summer Institute.

Recommendation: Approve an agreement with AVID Center to provide AVID memberships and site licenses for eight (8) secondary school sites and two (2) elementary school sites, effective July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021. The secondary sites are: Frisbie Middle School, Jehue Middle School, Kolb Middle School, Kucera Middle School, Rialto Middle School, Carter High School, Eisenhower High School, and Rialto High School. The elementary sites are: Curtis Elementary School and Preston Elementary School.
