Brenda Parker, DAAPAC President, shared the success of the annual Black History celebration which was held on Saturday, February 22, 2020, introduced some of the DAAPAC Board members, and thanked all those that attended, including Dr. Avila, Dr. McDuffie, Ms. Walker, and Mr. Montes. They presented the Board, the Superintendent and the administration with an official DAAPAC pin, and encouraged everyone to put them on when they attend the DAAPAC meetings. Lisa Lindberg, REA President, thanked everyone for listening to the concerns of her members on February 12, 2020 and hopes that this will result in true action. She addressed the concerns of some of the Board members and talked about budget constraints. She also shared data regarding the increase in administrative positions in the District over the years. She provided the Board with supporting documentation and stated that there are more resources at the District office than at the school sites. She also talked about seven elementary schools that do not have assistant principals and have TOSA's, who are not able to do some of the requirements of an assistant principal, such as evaluations. She requested that we focus on the needs of the school sites and not the District office.

Chris Cordasco, CSEA President of Chapter 203, reported on the increasing concern with the classification and compensation study and its delay. The District and CSEA agreed on this process in October of 2018 and as of today he has not received a report. He stated that he was told that the District received a report and it was disseminated to management, which concerns him. He said that CSEA should have received it at the same time. He also talked about safety concerns and said he is aware of trainings available to employees that he believes would be very beneficial. He was made aware of Professional Crisis Management (PCM) training in

the spring that he is hoping will be offered to classified staff. He believes these trainings would improve the safety for both staff and students.

Mr. Cordasco shared that he enjoys sharing when situations can be resolved positively. There was a situation at Casey Elementary and Principal Velez and Mr. Bashaw were able to meet with him and come to agreement and resolve matter.

#### Background:

Pursuant to Education Code section 42131, twice each year, the Board of Education must certify to the San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools (SBCSS) and the California Department of Education (CDE) that the District can meet its financial obligations for the current and subsequent two fiscal years.

The Second Interim Financial Report presents actual to date data as of January 31, 2020. This report must be approved and certified as positive, qualified, or negative by the Governing Board and submitted to the SBCSS by March 15, 2020. The three certifications are defined as follows:

- 1. A Positive Certification means that a district will meet its financial obligations (including the 3 percent reserve) for the current and subsequent two fiscal years.
- 2. A Qualified Certification means that a district <u>may not</u> meet its financial obligations for the current or subsequent two fiscal years (less than the 3 percent reserve in any year).
- 3. A Negative Certification means that a district will not meet its financial obligations for the remainder of the fiscal year or for the next subsequent fiscal year (depleted cash).

#### Reasoning:

The Second Interim Report consists of projections for average daily attendance (ADA) and General Fund Summary (revenues, expenditures, and fund balance) for the current and subsequent two fiscal years. Also included are a current year Cash Flow Projection, a Summary Review of State Financial Criteria and Standards, and a Certification that the District will meet its financial obligations for the current and subsequent two fiscal years.

The Second Interim Financial Report (under separate cover) and Assumptions and Recap are presented to the Board of Education for approval with a **Positive Certification** as the District will meet its financial obligations for the current fiscal year and subsequent two fiscal years.

TEXTBOOK ADOPTION FOR TRANSITIONAL KINDERGARTEN

Background: On June 1st 2016, the Board adopted McGraw Hill's Wonders as the

English Language Arts Core curriculum for grades k-5.

Reasoning: At the time that the curriculum was adopted, McGraw Hill did not have a

transitional kindergarten textbook in their Wonders series. Since the 2016/17 school year, kindergarten and transitional kindergarten have used the same **Wonders** kindergarten curriculum. As we move to full day kindergarten, the transitional kindergarten teachers will need their own separate Transitional Kindergarten **World of Wonders** curriculum which is now available through McGraw Hill. **World of Wonders** is an early childhood literacy program that provides developmentally appropriate instruction for young learners, including cross-curricular activities, focus on socio-emotional development, and preparation for kindergarten and

beyond.

Recommendation: Approve the textbook adoption of World of Wonders to be used as the

core English Language Arts curriculum for transitional kindergarten

classrooms starting in the 2020/21 school year.

## REDUCTION OF PARTICULAR KINDS OF SERVICES

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 19-20-45**

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Rialto Unified School District has determined that due to financial conditions it is in the best interests of the District and the welfare of the schools and the pupils thereof that the particular kinds of services set forth herein must be reduced or discontinued; and

WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the Board that because of the aforementioned reason, it is in the best interest of the District that the number of regular certificated employees of the District must be reduced; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Rialto Unified School District as follows:

A. That the particular kinds of services set forth below shall be reduced or eliminated commencing in the 2020-2021 school year:

Elementary Teacher	5	F.T.E.
High School CTE Law Enforcement Teacher	1	F.T.E.
High School CTE Manufacturing/Machinist Teacher	1	F.T.E.
High School Physical Education Teacher	1	F.T.E.

- B. That due to the reduction or elimination of particular kinds of services, a corresponding number of certificated employees of the District shall be terminated pursuant to Education Code section 44955.
- C. That the reduction of certificated staff be achieved by the termination of regular employees and not by terminating temporary or substitute employees.

- D. That "competency" as described in Education Code sections 44955, 44956 and 44957 for the purposes of bumping and reemployment shall necessarily include: (1) possession of a valid preliminary or clear credential in the relevant subject matter area; (2) a valid (not emergency) English Language Learner authorization; (3) to bump a single subject credential holder in a secondary departmentalized position, a single subject credential in the relevant subject matter area; (4) for specialty positions, including AVID, CTE courses and coordinator positions, and work experience coordinator positions, the relevant required certificates and/or credentials, and training; and (5) at least one full year of experience in the last ten years teaching/serving in the position to be assumed.
- E. That, as between certificated employees with the same seniority date, the order of termination shall be determined solely by Board-adopted criteria.
- F. That the District Superintendent or designee is directed to initiate layoff procedures and give appropriate notice pursuant to Education Code sections 44955 and 44949.
